8th Grade Elective Descriptions 2019-20

Inquiring Minds: A Project-Based Science Elective

Inquiring Minds is a science elective that will provide the opportunity for students to become involved with a variety of science and technology related projects. The program is divided into different topics that lead students to design and discover more about the world God has created.

Chapel Music

Make a joyful noise unto the Lord! Students will select and prepare music for chapel and help lead the worship time by singing, playing instruments, and/or speaking. If you sign up and play guitar, keyboard or percussion, please indicate your instrument on the form.

Around the World in 80 Days!

Travel the 7 continents to learn more about the world's landforms, cultures, music, foods, and much more. Whether by plane, train, automobile or boat you will discover God's world through the eyes of those who live in it. The semester will end with a World Fair.

Computer- Creative Coding

Students will learn how to think like a programmer through basic computer science and coding. They will use interactive online programs to help better understand computational thinking. Students will be introduced to various programming languages to be used to solve problems. Students will collaborate in teams to complete an end of semester computer programming project.

Introduction to Sign Language

Come learn how to speak without making a sound, converse while eating without getting reprimanded for talking with your mouth full, applaud without clapping, and sign instead of sing. During the Introduction to Sign Language course you will learn how to fingerspell as well as learn some basic ASL (American Sign Language). We will use games, music, and videos along with regular classroom stuff. Students will have lots of opportunities to practice using and understanding ASL.

Drama (Skywalker Shakespeare)

What if Luke Skywalker met William Shakespeare? The result would be drama on an epic, intergalactic scale, and that's what this course offers! We will explore both the language and plays of William Shakespeare and the plot and themes of the Star Wars saga. Students will learn basic acting and stage combat techniques and will stage scenes from both Shakespeare and Star Wars to present to an audience.
