The AACS Association meeting, open to all K-12 faculty, staff, and families enrolled during the 2019-2020 school year, was held on June 30. A total of 114 community members joined us virtually and 31 gathered in person at the Kerr Center. For those of you not able to join us, here are the highlights:

- The school's 2020-2021 budget was approved, with an appropriately conservative enrollment projection of 780 students. We concluded this year with 913 students, and our current enrollment for 2020-2021 is just over 800 students.
